Just for today I will have a quiet half hour all by myself to relax and enjoy all that God is giving me.

Just for today I will be unafraid, believing that as I trust in God with all my heart and lean not on my own understanding, He will lead me along a good path.

Just for today I will seek to serve others with kindness, doing what is right, and walking humbly with God.

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How To Enjoy New Life With God In Recovery

God created us to have a wonderful life. In love, God planned for us and carefully put us together. God has always been calling out to us to enter into a relationship of love with Him. He doesn't force us but He invites us. Many of us have learned what a painful and confusing wreck our lives become when we try to live independently from God. Today is a good day to begin to live the full and rich life God intended for us. Nothing in our past can keep us from this life, if we want it and choose for it.

The 12-Steps remind us that our lives are unmanageable without the loving care of God and that we can get to know and come to believe that He is a power greater than ourselves. As we turn our will and our lives over to God's care, we find a solid foundation upon which to build a new life.

When we confess our sin and brokenness to God, repent and turn towards God, He gives us new life. When we invite God to come into our lives we find that He is ready and waiting for us. A simple prayer like the following, offered sincerely, establishes this new relationship with God that will last forever.

God, my life is unmanageable without you. You created me to live in relationship with you. There really is no good way to live on my own. Forgive me for not including you. I turn from my independent ways and surrender my will and my life to you. Thank you Jesus for dying on the cross for my sins and making a way for me to have new life and be filled up with Your Holy Spirit. Come into my heart and wash me clean. Teach me to do your will. Transform my way of thinking. Strengthen me to obey You in all I do. Amen

If you prayed that prayer sincerely from your heart, God forgives you and receives you. God makes you His son or daughter. COMMITTED TO LIFE AND GROWTH

The story is told of a pig and a chicken having a conversation about a meal they wanted to provide for their friends. The chicken suggested bacon and eggs for the menu. The pig responded "Not on your life! For you that's just a contribution. For me, it's a total commitment."

Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth. I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. (2 Timothy 2:15, Romans 12:1 NIV)

To grow and mature and do well in any area of life requires commitment. To develop their skills, professional athletes consistently practice for long hours, at inconvenient times, over many years. Medical professionals spend huge amounts of time and money to learn the necessary skills to properly care for patients who are injured or sick.

Maintaining our life with God in recovery also takes time and effort. The habits and disciplines we began to practice when we got sober need to be carried on if we are to maintain our sobriety. We improve our conscious contact with God by praying and meditating on His Word each day and then carrying out His will in all our affairs. Sometimes it will be convenient and many times it will not.

Moving away from a focus on God's plan for our lives into a focus of "me and my needs/problems" is a constant challenge for us in recovery and for those who are just living life. Deciding that going our own way will work better than God's instructions and the advice of trusted friends is a temptation we will face repeatedly. Have we decided that God's way is best and committed to His plan no matter what? This is the challenge in turning our will and our life over to the care of God. It's not a one-time pledge but an everyday commitment.

Commit everything you do to the Lord. Trust him, and he will help you. (Psalm 37:5 NLT)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Once again I turn my will and my life – all the plans and ideas I have about today – over to Your care. Show me Your will and help me to walk in it. Amen

To grow and mature and do well in any area of life requires commitment.

FINDING PURPOSE

From time to time some of us get into a rut and struggle to see the purpose that God has for our lives. We have given our will and life over to God's care and are now waiting to see what He will do as we ask for His help to turn our lives around. While we are waiting there is something all of us can do. We can improve our conscious contact with God by praying and reading the Scriptures. This helps us increase our knowledge of God and we will grow in wisdom as we learn what His Word says. We could also join a group who are studying the Scriptures.

Now the Berean Jews were of more noble character than those in Thessalonica, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true. (Acts 17:11 NIV)

God has a purpose for each of our lives, but we need to have conscious contact with Him to find out what it is.

Both groups mentioned in the above Scripture were Jewish, but only the Berean group examined the Scriptures every day to see if what they heard was true. With no particular purpose in their lives, they could just have stood around doing nothing. When they heard something different from what they understood to be true they made the effort to verify the truth of what they heard. We also will find purpose for our life when we do the same. We need to know if the things we are being taught about God are true and the only way to find out is to read the Bible and ask the Holy Spirit to give us understanding.

And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but as it

actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe. (1 Thessalonians 2:13 NIV)

God has a purpose for each of our lives, but we need to have conscious contact with Him to find out what it is. If we make it our objective to seek God's will, His favour and honor will rest on us, and we will be successful in His plan for our life.

Whoever pursues righteousness and love finds life, prosperity and honor. (Proverbs 21:21 NIV)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Give me the desire to seek You with all my heart and to honour You in all my ways. Let Your Word be a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. Amen

THE END AND THE BEGINNING

In just a few hours the new calendar year will begin. After a challenging year with much turmoil around the globe, on what basis do we hope to have a better year? Often, we feel overwhelmed at the start of a new year because we have so much stuff to wade through, so many unanswered questions in our minds, and so many painful things in our hearts. If we have come and gone from recovery in the past year, we might be concerned about our future ability to maintain the peace and joy of sobriety for any length of time.

God's answer is very positive, very simple and very direct. It comes in the form of an invitation: ***Repent! Turn away from all your offenses; then sin will not be your downfall. Rid yourselves of all the offenses you have committed and get a new heart and a new spirit.*** (Ezekiel 18:30b-31 NIV)

As we wait for the countdown to this new year, it's worth remembering that God has promised us a new heart and a new spirit if we turn our will and our life over to His care. If we choose to do so and believe in the finished work of Jesus to redeem us from our sin, we will come into this new year as a new person.

Anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun! He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion (2 Corinthians 5:17 NLT, Philippians 1:6b NIV)

This coming year is a fresh opportunity to go deeper in our experience of coming to believe that a Power greater than ourselves can restore us to sanity. We can't fix ourselves, but God can. We may not trust our ability to carry anything through to completion but God *"could and would if He were sought."* This is our New Year's hope.

Prayer: Loving God, As I enter this New Year, I choose to commit myself to You. I repent of my past sins and lay down my fears and resentments. I receive Your forgiveness, Your comfort, and Your healing. I trust and have confidence in Your assurance that You will complete the good work You have begun in me. Amen

KNOWING GOD'S WILL FOR OUR LIVES

In Step-11 we commit through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God. We pray for knowledge of His will for our lives and the power to carry it out. Christmas is a time when we think of the plan that God had for Jesus when He came into this world as a human baby. About eight hundred years before Jesus was born the prophet Isaiah spoke of a sign regarding His birth.

...the Lord himself will give you the sign. Look! The virgin will conceive a child! She will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel (which means 'God is with us'). (Isaiah 7:14 NLT)

Jesus came at God's appointed time and angels announced His arrival to shepherds in the fields. We read in the Bible of many amazing things that God did to protect Jesus from those who wanted to cause Him harm. When we believe in Jesus, whom God sent into the world, God will protect us from any evil that might be planned against us. Jesus spoke often of His Father's love and care for those who accept Him and obey the Scriptures.

Those who accept my commandments and obey them are the ones who love me. And because they love me, my Father will love them. And I will love them and reveal myself to each of them. (John 14:21 NLT)

For more than two thousand years people have celebrated God's plan of salvation that was fulfilled through Jesus. Through prayer and meditation on God's Word we can know God's plan for our lives. God does not ask us to fulfill His plan on our own, He gives us the Holy Spirit to help us. Jesus said if we want to be His disciples, we must deny ourselves and take up our cross and follow Him.

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If any of you wants to be my follower, you must give up your own way, take up your cross, and follow me. If you try to hang on to your life, you will lose it. But if you give up your life for my sake, you will save it." (Matthew 16:24-25 NLT)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Thank You for Jesus who came to earth to fulfill Your plan of redemption for mankind. Please show me Your will for my life and strengthen me by the Power of Your Holy Spirit to carry it out. Amen

WALKING WARILY OR TAKING STEPS TENDERLY

Christmas lights brighten the darkness of December evenings and are a reminder to us that no matter how dark this season may be, the coming of Jesus into the world brought light, and hope, and joy. Jesus is the light of the world. Jesus is the reason for the season.

Jesus spoke to the people once more and said, "I am the light of the world. If you follow me, you won't have to walk in darkness, because you will have the light that leads to life." (John 8:12 NLT)

If we call on Him, God will be our shelter in times of trouble. Where there is darkness in our lives, God will bring light. When we walk with Him, He will lead us to the pathway of peace. In the past we walked alone in our sorrow. Now that God is with us, we need never face our problems alone. God may not be physically visible, but we have His Word that He watches over us and will keep us from harm.

I am GOD, your God, who teaches you how to live right and well. I show you what to do, where to go. If you had listened all along to what I told you, your life would have flowed full like a river, blessings rolling in like waves from the sea. (Isaiah 48:17-18 MSG)

When we allow the light of Christ to shine on our circumstances, His truth will overcome the darkness in our souls. As Christmas lights need to be plugged in and turned on so their beauty can be seen, so we need to be connected to God through faith in Jesus so that the truth and light within us can be seen. As we obey God's principles and are plugged into the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit, we will shine brightly through any darkness we may encounter.

Because of God's tender mercy, the morning light from heaven is about to break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, and to guide us to the path of peace." (Luke 1:78-79 NLT)

Prayer: Light of the World, Please guide me out of darkness and lead me into Your glorious light and peace. Amen

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GET EVEN OR GET AHEAD

Time wasted in getting even will never assist us in getting ahead.

Be sure that no one pays back wrong for wrong. But always try to do what is good for each other and for all people. (1 Thessalonians 5:15 ERV)

We feel hurt and violated when someone's unkind words or actions take away our dignity and leave us scared, and in need of healing. We want that person to admit to the harm they have caused us. We want them to make amends. If they don't, something arises within us and makes us want to "get even with them."

Let's not waste time on trying to get even and instead co-operate with God and really get ahead.

When a person verbally abuses us, we may think we will feel better if we yell back at that person or retaliate by publicly shaming them in some way. Research tells us we are no better off even as soon as five or fifteen minutes later. We violate our own soul and our own standards of right and wrong when we shout and behave badly in pursuing revenge. God has a better plan.

Don't do wrong to anyone to pay them back for doing wrong to you. Or don't insult anyone to pay them back for insulting you. But ask God to bless them. Do this because you yourselves were chosen to receive a blessing. A gentle answer makes anger disappear, but a rough answer makes it grow. (1 Peter 3:9, Proverbs 15:1 ERV)

The bottom line is, each one of us has done many wrong things over the course of our lives, and maybe even in the past few days. We come to God and seek His forgiveness for what we have done, and we should. But God links our forgiveness of what we have done to our willingness to forgive others for the wrongs they have done to us. Let's not waste time by

trying to get even and instead co-operate with God and really get ahead.

When you are praying and you remember that you are angry with another person about something, forgive that person. Forgive them so that your Father in heaven will also forgive your sins. (Mark 11:25 ERV)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, It's so hard to not seek revenge when I have been wronged. I lay this desire to "get even" aside and ask You to fill my heart with the higher good of forgiving others for their wrongs as I have been forgiven for the wrongs I have done. Amen

STANDING FIRM

As we come to the end of another year and watch news reports which review the events of the past year, we realize how quickly some things change and yet how slowly other things seem to leave. What do we do with all that has gone on in recent times and how do we safely make the move into the new year?

This is a time to remember that God is in control and will fulfill His purposes. Much more is going on in the world than what we may see and hear in the daily news. When we seek God's help in our personal challenges, we are assured that He will help us and bring about those things He has promised. Even when people think they have failed to live up to the potential God has for them, God remains unwavering in His plans, and He will work out His purpose for those who commit their will and life into His care.

For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm. The Lord foils the plans of the nations; he thwarts the purposes of the peoples. But the plans of the Lord stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations. (Psalm 33:9-11 NIV)

We must continue to have faith in God's ultimate control if we are to find peace in this fragile and sometimes frightening world. The invitation to us in this week between Christmas and the New Year is to reaffirm our trust in God's promises and His ability to bring about His purposes no matter how chaotic things may appear. We need to wholeheartedly trust God's Word and His vision for us as we firmly hold fast to His promises.

When the storm has swept by, the wicked are gone, but the righteous stand firm forever. (Proverbs 10:25 NIV)

When God says that we will not be overwhelmed, He means it. When God says He will make a way where there seems to be no way, He is able to do just that.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, You truly are the Prince of Peace. During this "in between time", come and live in me and strengthen me to follow Your Principles in all my ways. Amen

When we seek God's help in our personal challenges, we are assured that He will help us and bring about those things He has promised.

SHARING THE MESSAGE

Within each personal story of the journey from bondage to freedom is the power of the Gospel to save those who are lost. We are simply sinners saved by grace and kept clean and sober daily by God's mercy. When we tell our story, our lives give witness to God's grace and mercy, and we are fulfilling the great commission of spreading the good news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to others. We are pointing them to the pathway of their own healing journey with Jesus who said:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor. He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind; to set at liberty those who are oppressed;" (Luke 4:18 NKJV)

Within each personal story of the journey from bondage to freedom is the power of the Gospel to save those who are lost.

The Bible tells us that if someone struggles, we should be gentle and humble as we help them get back on the right path. When we begin to understand where they are at right now, it is important to remind ourselves how unstable we were when we were slaves to our addiction. We need to support the desire in a person's spirit to carry out their new life choices, even while their flesh is weak. We also need to respectfully warn those whom we perceive are in ongoing danger.

Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. (Lamentations 3:22-23 NIV)

We are not the Saviour, but we can love others as He loves us. Love goes beyond mere words. Sometimes it is demonstrated in silence or in an understanding touch as we come alongside someone who has strayed from the path of recovery. Love doesn't accuse but rather encourages the person to get back on the path to healing and continue the journey.

Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10)

Prayer: Lord Jesus, May my life reflect the joy of living life to the full with You so that others may believe in the power of the Gospel to save and transform lives. Amen

THE UNFAMILIAR

Coming into a recovery group is threatening for many of us. The place is unfamiliar. We don't know the people, and compared to our former lifestyle, the rules seem restrictive. We are not even acquainted with the God we prayed to when we knew we needed help. We are in unfamiliar territory and unsure if recovery is for us. Thankfully, we can repeatedly cry out to God for help to get us through the unfamiliar, and God assures us that He will help.

Ah, God, listen to my prayer, my cry—open your ears. Don't be callous; just look at these tears of mine. I'm a stranger here. I don't know my way—a migrant like my whole family. Give me a break, cut me some slack before it's too late and I'm out of here. (Psalm 39:12-13 MSG)

If we listen attentively, we will hear God's quiet voice encouraging us to be at peace and allow Him to settle our hearts as we make necessary adjustments. If we choose for God and all His ways, rather than quitting, we will be accompanied by the One who is full of wisdom, compassion, and unfailing love for us.

Show me the right path, O Lord; point out the road for me to follow. Lead me by your truth and teach me, for you are the God who saves me. All day long I put my hope in you. (Psalm 25:4-5 NLT)

As we put our trust in God to help us, we will soon relax and become familiar with the routine of the program we have chosen. We will get to know the people around us and allow them to get to know us. If we have surrendered our will and our lives over to the care of God, nothing will be impossible for us to achieve. We will soon be aware that our fear of the unfamiliar has abated, and the power of God will continue to strengthen us as we begin our new life with Him in recovery.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, You are ever present with me in my time of need. When I am challenged by the unfamiliar, give me the confidence to remain close to You and do the next right thing. Thank You for being my safe harbour from the storms of life. Amen

We can repeatedly cry out to God for help to get us through the unfamiliar, and God assures us that He will help.

DEALING WITH STRESS – THIS TOO SHALL PASS

When we are dealing with stress the slogan ‘this too shall pass’ is a helpful principle to remember. God’s unfailing love surrounds and supports us in every situation, and His strength is sufficient for all our needs. We can get through challenging days, get the rest we need, and face the next day with confidence, because God is always with us. When our hope is in the living God, we cannot fail. Troubling times will come, but good days will return.

The faithful love of the LORD never ends! His mercies never cease. Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning. I say to myself, “The LORD is my inheritance; therefore, I will hope in him!”
(Lamentations 3:22-24 NLT)

God seeks to use our stressful times as opportunities for us to gain His perspective, lean on His strength, and develop perseverance.

God will never permit circumstances to break or shatter us. He knows our limits and will not allow us to be stretched beyond what we can bear. God seeks to use our stressful times as opportunities for us to gain His perspective, lean on His strength, and develop perseverance with which we can better run life’s course. God may not alter the circumstance that is currently pressing on us. He may not remove the person who is bothering us. He may not heal the condition that daily grates away at our body and soul, but God will dramatically alter our emotions and responses as we improve our conscious contact with Him and seek answers from His Word. As we trust in the wisdom of God to resolve our situations, we will gain spiritual maturity and endurance.

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise—in God I trust and am not afraid. What can mere mortals do to me? (Psalm 56:3-4 NIV)

We deal best with stress when we call on God for help, acknowledge that He is on our side, and faithfully do what He says. With God’s help, “this too shall pass.”

Prayer: Heavenly Father, When life is overwhelming and I feel distant from You, help me to remember that You truly are listening when I pray, and are working in every situation for my good. I am forever grateful that You love and care for me. Amen

THE GOD OF CHRISTMAS IS WITH US NOW

The presents have been opened. Most of the turkey has been eaten. With Christmas Eve and Christmas Day behind us, it’s a good time to review our lives, our relationships, and even our hopes and dreams for the coming year.

God is righteous, and His wisdom is infinite. There’s nothing harsh or unkind in God’s nature. We were created to be like God but sin spoiled God’s creation. As we have gathered in family groups or with friends to celebrate Christmas, many of us have witnessed sinful ways at work. Sometimes a gathering is ruined by bitterness related to a past event or ongoing addictive behaviour. We are called to love each other yet we still say and do things that disappoint and anger one another.

We truly are sinful broken people living in a sinful broken world. The joy of the Christmas story is that Jesus came to earth to show us God’s love and to provide a way for us to be free from sin and brokenness.

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord. God saved you by his grace when you believed. And you can’t take credit for this; it is a gift from God.
(Romans 6:23, Ephesians 2:8 NLT)

Many of the new gadgets and devices received as gifts will need to be powered up or have batteries installed. The new gift of life that God is offering us requires that we invite Jesus into our lives and connect to His Power through the Holy Spirit. As we meditate on His Words that are written in the Bible, God will teach us how our lives are meant to be lived and, as we daily seek His help, He will support and direct us in all our ways.

The Lord says, “I will guide you along the best pathway for your life. I will advise you and watch over you. (Psalm 32:8 NLT)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Thank you for the gift of new life You are offering me. I am willing to accept this new way of life and allow You to guide and direct me in all my ways. Amen

THE DAY AFTER CHRISTMAS

At Christmas, many people make a special effort to return home and be with their family. For those of us, who for many reasons, are unable to gather with family at Christmas, is it still possible to celebrate a full and rich Christmas without being fake? The lives of Joseph and Mary and Jesus teach us that it is possible.

We need to look at our hearts before we look at our circumstances and see the amazing guest who shares this season with us.

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them. (Luke 2:1, 3-7 NIV)

Joseph and Mary were displaced at a crucial time in their lives. In a stable – a rough cave in the side of a hill where animals were sheltered for the night – they made ready and welcomed Jesus into the world. Other guests came – shepherds who were directed by a heavenly host of angels to where the baby was. Mary and Joseph might not have been where they wanted to be but, together with the shepherds, the animal shelter was turned into a wondrous place of worship.

At Christmas, we celebrate Jesus who chose displacement from His Father in Heaven and came to earth in the form of a human baby so He could redeem us from the power of sin. Until the fulfillment of time and the invitation to come to His Father's house, Jesus, in the power of His Holy Spirit,

will be with us wherever we may be here on this earth. This Christmas we need to look at our hearts before we look at our circumstances and see the amazing guest who shares this season with us. Life may not be as perfect as we would like it to be, and we may be struggling to cope, but Jesus is with us! Let's be at home with Jesus this Christmas season as we celebrate His birth.

Prayer: Thank You Jesus for coming to be with me in my imperfect world. I want to make room for You in my heart and share each day of this Christmas season together with You. Amen

THE EFFECTS OF OUR CHOICES

The choices we make affect not only our own life but the lives of our loved ones as well. When we do not seek God or acknowledge that He exists, then we are choosing to rebel against Him. If we are not loving God with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength, and loving our neighbor as ourselves, then we are choosing to disobey God, and this will have a negative impact on all our relationships. Unkind actions, and the gaps created by our failing to reach out with care and blessing, will affect everyone in our family and circle of friends.

God describes this condition this way: *Now listen! Today I am giving you a choice between life and death, between prosperity and disaster ... love the Lord your God and keep his commands, decrees, and regulations by walking in his ways. If you do this, you will live and multiply, and the Lord your God will bless you ... But if your heart turns away and you refuse to listen, and if you are drawn away to serve and worship other gods, then I warn you now that you will certainly be destroyed. (Deuteronomy 30:15-18a NLT)*

To a sensible person these would seem like easy choices – life over death; prosperity over disaster; blessings over curses. Unfortunately, many of us choose to follow our own ways and desires and suffer the harmful consequences of doing so. Why? We don't want to give up our sinful pleasures and we want to maintain control of our circumstances. Getting our own way seems like the most convenient and pleasant path for a time. That's why we choose it. God, through the death of his beloved son Jesus, has shown us the cost of our sinful choices. Jesus died a punishing death on a cross to pay the price for our sin.

God's unfailing love and forgiveness are available to us even when we have made unwise choices. By His grace we are strengthened and made strong to overcome any weaknesses that may still exist within us.

Prayer: Loving God, I ask for forgiveness for my rebellious ways. Strengthen my resolve to obey You in all I say and do. My desire is to love You with all my heart, soul, and mind. I am forever grateful for Your Power which will help me overcome my weaknesses. Amen

If we are not loving God with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength and loving our neighbor as ourselves, then we are choosing to disobey God, and this will have a negative impact on all our relationships.

NEW PERSON – NEW RULES – NEW ACTIONS

Step-9 requires that we make direct amends to the people we have harmed, except when to do so would further harm them or others. Making a list of those we harmed was not easy for us and becoming willing to make amends seems even harder. God was likely not on our radar when we did the things that harmed others but by our offense against them, we also offended God.

God, having raised up his servant, sent him to you first, to bless you by turning every one of you from your wickedness. (Acts 3:26 ESV)

We make direct amends to the people we have harmed, except when to do so would further harm them or others.

The new person we have become acts with different rules than the old person we once were. That's because we gave our will and life over to the care of God and were reconciled to Him through accepting the finished work of Jesus on our behalf. The offences we committed against God have been acquitted and we have been restored to that place where we are free from all our sin. In the eyes of God, we are just as if we had never sinned.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. (2 Corinthians 5:17-18 ESV)

God has given us the ministry of reconciliation. Therefore, just as we came to God and asked His forgiveness, we now need to go to those we have harmed and ask for their forgiveness. The work that God has done in us and the new nature we have received will help us do those things that God desires for us to do. We have been given a Power greater than ourselves, the Holy Spirit, and He will strengthen us to do those things we need to do so that we may be reconciled with others.

Now it is God who makes both us and you stand firm in Christ. He anointed us, set his seal of ownership on us, and put his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come. (2 Corinthians 1:21-22 NIV)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Thank You for Jesus who paid the price for my sin and reconciled me to You. Please give me the will and desire to make direct amends to those I have harmed and where possible seek reconciliation. Amen

MERRY CHRISTMAS

Christmas -- it really happened! God came to our planet. We may never comprehend how or even why He chose to do this, but the fact remains, He came by way of a Bethlehem manger. We matter to God, the God who created the heavens and the earth.

When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? (Psalm 8:3-4 NIV)

Jesus was born as the prophets foretold, conceived by an act of God, born of a virgin. He was born at the time, in the place, and to the people God planned from before creation. Throughout time God sent various signs so people would recognize Jesus as the One He sent to save us. Some did. Some didn't. The fact is, Jesus came to save us and obeyed the plan of His Father even to death on a cross.

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. (Isaiah 7:14 NIV)

We are significant people because of our connection to God through Jesus Christ whose birth we celebrate on Christmas Day. REPENTANCE and FORGIVENESS

For the kind of sorrow God wants us to experience leads us away from sin and results in salvation. There's no regret for that kind of sorrow. But worldly sorrow, which lacks repentance, results in spiritual death. (2 Corinthians 7:10 NLT)

When we struggled in the chaos of our addiction, we acknowledged that some of our actions were harmful. However, we generally blamed the occurrence of negative events in our past to justify our ongoing selfish behaviour. People who harmed us or our former life circumstances were to blame. We became greedy, self-indulgent and self-centered individuals and decided to shape our lives around what we thought we needed, deserved, or what we determined needed fixing. The building block for living well in recovery with God is changing our mind about who is responsible for our brokenness and how we got to where we are.

Our chance at having a real life comes when we humbly turn our will and life over to God's care and accept the responsibility for our sinful responses. We also need to admit that we messed things up for ourselves and others by trying to sort out past events on our own.

Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord. (Acts 3:19 NIV)

When we begin the journey of our new life in Christ, there may be times when we fail to live in love. Genuine sadness over our behaviour and a willingness to change our old ways and seek God for cleansing and healing is true repentance that honours God and restores our relationship with Him

Prayer: Gracious God, Forgive me for ignoring You and not taking responsibility for my past behaviour. Cleanse and heal my heart and renew a right spirit within me. I desire to honour You in all my ways. I am grateful that You love and care for me. Amen

DEFEATING ACCUSATION AND CONDEMNATION

Our weaknesses are no surprise to God. God strengthens us in areas where we have grown and encourages us in the areas where we still need to grow. God reassures us that His grace is sufficient to meet all our needs, and His power is sufficient to support us when we acknowledge our weakness.

You, Lord, hear the desire of the afflicted; you encourage them, and you listen to their cry. (Psalm 10:17 NIV)

God is aware that on our journey we will make mistakes as part of our growing and maturing.

Where the evil one says, "Failure," God says, "You are growing more and more like Jesus." How comforting and reassuring it is to know that God is aware that on our journey we will make mistakes as part of our growing and maturing.

And the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness ... we don't know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us ... the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will. And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them. (Romans 8:26-28 NLT)

How do we defeat discouragement in life and recovery when others accuse and condemn us? Jesus tells us: ***"But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."*** (Luke 6:27-28 NIV)

We need to let go of negative words from others or from our own self-criticism. God speaks the truth to us in love and He challenges us to do the same when we speak to others, or to ourselves. When we confess our sin and shortcomings to God and turn away from sin, God sees us through the blood of Jesus, which purifies us from all the wrongs we have done. God's word is trustworthy, and He will never accuse or condemn us for past sins which have been washed in the blood of Jesus.

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. (Romans 8:1 NIV)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I am glad that my weakness is no surprise to You. Thank You that I am free from all accusation and condemnation as I grow in my new life with You. Amen

As the Twelve Traditions are read at meetings we attend, we usually join the reader on the final phrase with the words, “principles before personalities.”

Mary responded, “Oh, how my soul praises the Lord. How my spirit rejoices in God my Savior! For he took notice of his lowly servant girl, and from now on all generations will call me blessed. WHAT DOES GOSSIP SOUND LIKE?

Gossip shows up in our lives in many forms. God hates them all because He knows how harmful destructive words are to our dignity and our relationships. Here are some types of gossip and what God's Word says about each of them. In which of the following categories does the tendency to gossip affect me?

1. Slander spreads rumors or lies about a person in order to damage them. ***Hiding hatred makes you a liar; slandering others makes you a fool.*** (Proverbs 10:18 NLT)

2. Rumors abound. We hear something and even though it's not confirmed we pass it along. Gossip spreads and harm is done. ***Careful words make for a careful life; careless talk may ruin everything.*** (Proverbs 13:3 MSG)

3. Speaking with innuendo and planting seeds of doubt which question another person's character or actions, is another destructive form of gossip. ***By our speech we can ruin the world, turn harmony to chaos, throw mud on a reputation, send the whole world up in smoke and go up in smoke with it, smoke right from the pit of hell.*** (James 3:6 MSG)

4. It's easy to complain about things which are not perfect or aren't going our way. This "behind the scenes gossiping" can cause great harm. ***Complain if you must, but don't lash out. Keep your mouth shut, and let your heart do the talking. Build your case before God and wait for his verdict.*** (Psalm 4:4-5 MSG)

5. Bad-mouthing, back-stabbing, back-biting. These words seek to describe the harmful practice of speaking negative and harmful words about someone who isn't there to defend themselves. The Bible says: ***Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. Don't speak evil against each other, dear brothers and sisters. If you criticize and judge each other, then you are criticizing and judging God's law.*** (Matthew 7:1; James 4:11 NLT)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, You hate gossip because of the harm it does to everyone involved. Help me to speak kind words and deal with difficulties in an open, kind, and truthful way. Amen

SELF-ESTEEM

Our self-esteem is based on how we evaluate and see ourselves. Some people see little value in themselves while others rate themselves highly. A person with low self-esteem may have trouble expressing their needs and ideas to another and may have little confidence in themselves to make right decisions. They are more likely to criticize themselves to someone else. The opposite is true of those who rate themselves highly. The truth is, God made all of us. We are His creation and God has put high value on each person regardless of their status in life.

Lord, you are our Father. We are the clay. You are the potter. Your hands made all of us. (Isaiah 64:8 NIRV)

God puts high value on each person regardless of their status in life.

When we have made a mess of our lives, we often think that the consequences of our actions in the past define who we are in the future. We have low self-esteem and do not see a way forward. Our pride may stop us from seeking the help we need. God sees things differently from us. Just like a potter, God will take a piece of flawed clay and rework it until what He has formed is perfected for the use he has in mind. When we are weary and burdened with life, God wants us to come to Him and be made new.

Come to me, all you who are tired and are carrying heavy loads. I will give you rest. Become my servants and learn from me. I am gentle and free of pride. You will find rest for your souls. (Matthew 11:28-29 NIRV)

God does not want our self-esteem to be less than the value He places on us, and He does not want us to be prideful and think of ourselves more highly than we ought. He wants us to think of ourselves with sober judgment and in the light of His love for us. God wants to reproduce His character in us.

You were taught to be made new in your thinking. You were taught to start living a new life. It is created to be truly good and holy, just as God is. (Ephesians 4:23-24 NIRV)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Please help me to see myself as You see me. Help me to take every thought captive to You so that You can perfect my way of thinking and enable me to become the person You created me to be. Amen

DEALING WITH CRISIS

Joseph and Mary were a family in crisis. Mary, by God's plan and action, was pregnant prior to being married to Joseph. They had probably dealt with the undeserved community backlash for several months and now with the birth of the child imminent, they needed to make a long journey to the hometown of Joseph's ancestors to be counted in a census that was related to being taxed.

Throughout this past year, most nations in the world seem to have stumbled from one crisis to another. Those of us who have come through addictive and destructive lifestyles know about un-ending crises. The good news is that when life throws us a curve ball, God wants us to experience the stabilizing comfort of His presence and to trust His promise that He is with us every step of the way.

In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. (John 16:33b, Philippians 4:6 NIV)

We do not face any crisis alone, we do it with God, and He has committed to helping us be overcomers. Our part is to include God in what is going on and to seek His guidance in every situation. It is best to learn to do that when the pressure isn't on, but we can be assured that whenever we do call out for God's help, He hears us and is available to help.

Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. (James 1:2-4 NIV)

God may not immediately change our situation. He may change us so we are able to do more than we thought possible, and in the process benefit from becoming wiser. In the middle of pressure, none of us like the seemingly endless endurance, but God knows what we need to face, what is yet to come, and He carefully prepares us for what is ahead – even in times of crisis.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Please comfort and quiet my heart and help me to trust You. Teach me Your ways that I might gain wisdom. I want to become mature and, as You direct, persevere through any pressure I might face. Amen
