Monday

THE EFFECTS OF OUR CHOICES

The choices we make affect not only our own life but the lives of our loved ones as well. When we do not seek God or acknowledge that He exists, then we are choosing to rebel against Him. If we are not loving God with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength, and loving our neighbor as ourselves, then we are choosing to disobey God, and this will have a negative impact on all our relationships. Unkind actions, and the gaps created by our failing to reach out with care and blessing, will affect everyone in our family and circle of friends.

The Bible reminds us: Now listen! Today I am giving you a choice between life and death, between prosperity and disaster... love the Lord your God and keep his commands, decrees, and regulations by walking in his ways. If you do this, you will live and multiply, and the Lord your God will bless you ... But if your heart turns away and you refuse to listen, and if you are drawn away to serve and worship other gods, then I warn you now that you will certainly be destroyed. (Deuteronomy 30:15-18a NLT)

It would seem like easy choices – life over death; prosperity over disaster; blessings over curses. Unfortunately, many of us choose to follow our own ways and desires. Why? Getting our own way seems like the most convenient and pleasant path. Fortunately, God's unfailing love and forgiveness are available to us even when we have made unwise choices. When we surrender to Him, we are strengthened and made strong to overcome any weaknesses that may still exist within us.

Prayer: Loving God, I ask for forgiveness for my rebellious ways. Strengthen my resolve to obey You in all I say and do. My desire is to love You with all my heart, soul, and mind. Amen Tuesday

NEW PERSON – NEW RULES – NEW ACTIONS

Step-9 requires that we make direct amends to the people we have harmed, except when to do so would further harm them or others. Making a list of those we harmed was not easy for us and becoming willing to make amends seems even harder. God was likely not on our radar when we did the things that harmed others but by our offense against them, we also offended God.

God, having raised up his servant, sent him to you first, to bless you by turning every one of you from your wickedness. (Acts 3:26 ESV)

The new person we have become acts with different rules than the old person we once were. That's because we gave our will and life over to the care of God. The offences we committed against God have been acquitted and God declares us from all our sin.

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. (2 Corinthians 5:17-18 ESV)

God has given us the ministry of reconciliation. Therefore, just as we came to God and asked His forgiveness, we now need to go to those we have harmed and ask for their forgiveness. The work that God has done in us and the new nature we have received will help us do those things that God desires for us to do. We have been given a Power greater than ourselves, the Holy Spirit, and He will strengthen us to do those things we need to do so that we may be reconciled with others.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Thank You for Jesus who paid the price for my sin and reconciled me to You. Please give me the will and desire to make direct amends to those I have harmed and where possible seek reconciliation. Amen

CITIZENS IN A NEW KINGOM

Your kingdom will never end, and you will rule forever. The Lord can be trusted in all that he says. He is loyal in all that he does. The Lord lifts up people who have fallen. He helps those who are in trouble. All living things look to you for their food, and you give them their food at the right time. You open your hands and give every living thing all that it needs. Everything the Lord does is good. (Psalm 145:13-17 ERV)

The kingdom of God is an everlasting kingdom in which we, who have given our will and lives over to the care of God, are citizens. Through Jesus we have been reconciled to our Heavenly Father. While we are here on earth we are to be God's representatives of Christ's heavenly kingdom. God wants to work in us and through us to help us become the persons He created us to be, and also to be a blessing to others. That means allowing the Holy Spirit to teach us and guide us in the ways of God. It also means getting rid of the self-centered desires of our fleshly nature.

In our life in recovery today, are we experiencing the joy and satisfaction of serving the King of kings and Lord of lords?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, Thank You for loving me enough to send Jesus into the world to restore my relationship with You. I am blessed to know that, as Your beloved child, I have the deposit of the Holy Spirit living in me, quaranteeing what is to come. Amen

HOPE FOR WHAT CONCERNS ME TODAY

Troubles come, sometimes one on top of another. Pressure builds. Sadness deepens. We ask, "Where is God in the middle of my troubles?" As we move towards the Christmas celebration of Jesus coming into this world of darkness and the chaos of life on this planet, let's really celebrate that He came to bring peace and hope to those who put their trust in Him.

This is GOD's Message, the God who made earth, made it livable and lasting, known everywhere as GOD: 'Call to me and I will answer you. I'll tell you marvelous and wondrous things that you could never figure out on your own.' (Jeremiah 33:2-3 MSG)

DEFEATING ACCUSATION AND CONDEMNATION

Our weaknesses are no surprise to God. God strengthens us in areas where we have grown and encourages us in the areas where we still need to grow. God reassures us that His grace is sufficient to meet all our needs, and His power is sufficient to support us when we acknowledge our weakness.

Where the evil one says, "Failure," God says, "You are growing more and more like Jesus." How comforting and reassuring it is to know that God is aware that on our journey we will make mistakes as part of our growing and maturing.

And the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness ... we don't know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us ... the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will. And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them. (Romans 8:26-28 NLT)

We need to let go of negative words from others or from our own self-criticism. God speaks the truth to us in love and He challenges us to do the same when we speak to others, or to ourselves. When we confess our sin and shortcomings to God and turn away from sin, God sees us through the blood of Jesus, which purifies us from all the wrongs we have done. God's word is trustworthy, and He will never accuse or condemn us for past sins which have been washed in the blood of Jesus.

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. (Romans 8:1 NIV)

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I am glad that my weakness is no surprise to You. Thank You that I am free from all accusation and condemnation as I grow in my new life with You. Amen
